School age Camp Registration opens up February 12th until full.

Summer camp is “first-come/first-served.” Please make your plans accordingly.

REGISTRATION INFORMATION

- Summer Camp is structured into **three, 3-week long sessions**
- Children may sign up for as many of the sessions offered. Sessions cannot be split. No exceptions.
- Children can register for two days (T, Th), three days (M, W, F), or five days per week (no 4 day option).
- Swim Camp and Spanish Camps are five days only.
- A non-refundable payment of the first full session per child is due at the time of registration. This payment serves as the deposit. **FORMS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED WITHOUT PAYMENT.**
- The remaining balance is due by June 4th, 2018 (Please note: school will be closed from May 28th to June 1st and the office will reopen on June 4th).
- Children who are new to GPCP must pay a non-refundable registration fee of \$50 per child in addition to the session fees listed below.

Early Arrival hours (7:30 am to 9:00 am) & Extended Day hours (1:00 pm to 6:00 pm) are offered at an extra cost of \$6.00/hour if prepaid OR \$8.00/hr if not prepaid. June’s prepaid form & payment will be due on Thursday, May 24th.

Final payment for the remaining balance is due by June 4th.
There will be no refunds for Summer Camp after May 21st, 2018.

Grant Park & the Circus Animals



Uncover and explore the details of our Atlanta Zoo through the tales and folklore of Grant Park history. We will tour and investigate the park in search of clues and evidence to cast theories of how the circus animals came to live in Grant Park. Through the languages of painting, photography, mapping, music and storytelling, we will explore and investigate the sites of Grant Park.

Cabbagetown & The Painted Stories



Join us in our journey to Cabbagetown where we will explore, reimagine, and interpret the stories of the town through its iconic murals and street art. Continuing our exploration with the languages of painting, photography, mapping, music and storytelling, we will interpret the sites and sounds of Cabbagetown as we try to decipher and decode the details of its colorful stories.

Atlanta's Beltline & The Trail of Trains



Following the trail of trains, we will explore and investigate the history of the Atlanta Beltline while also discovering and interpreting its newest artistic evolution. Through a process of interpreting old photos and current sights we will weave together theories, mixing facts, reality and imagination to inspire new stories. and encourage children's research in pursuit of possibilities supported by the languages of painting, photography, mapping, music and storytelling.
