



SCHOOL AGE Summer Camp 2018

Lego Camps coming back this year!

GPCP will be offering summer camps for school age children at our Cabbagetown Campus.

Summer camps for preschool age children will be offered at the Grant Park Campus.

Registration begins February 12nd until full.

Summer camp is "first-come/first-served". Please make your plans accordingly.

REGISTRATION INFORMATION

- School Age Summer Camp is structured into **seven- one week sessions**.
- Children may sign up for as many of the sessions offered.
- Lego Camps: we will offer 3 different LEGO Engineering camps: 2 during the week of June 18th - June 22nd and one during the week of July 9th - July 13th. All camps will be open to ages 5 - 8 and will run for roughly 4 hours - with our LEGO Instruction lasting for 3 hours. For the week of June 18th - June 22nd, there will be Full Day options for both the morning and afternoon LEGO Camps:
 - LEGO (Intro to STEM) in the morning + GPCP Extended Day hours (paid additionally)
 - Swim in the AM + LEGO (JEDI Engineering) in the Afternoon
 For the week of July 9th - July 13th, participants will have the chance to stay in GPCP's Extended Day program, however, there will only be a morning LEGO Camp
- A non-refundable payment of the first full session per child is due at the time of registration. This payment serves as the deposit. **FORMS WILL NOT BE ACCEPTED WITHOUT PAYMENT.**
- The remaining balance is due by June 4th, 2018 (Please note: School will be closed from May 28th to June 1st and the office will reopen on June 4th).
- Children who are new to GPCP must pay a nonrefundable registration fee of \$50 per child in addition to the session fees listed below.

SUMMER CAMP HOURS

Morning Camps from 9:00 am to 1:00 pm

Early Arrival hours (7:30 am to 9:00 am) & Extended Day hours (1:00 pm to 6:00 pm) are offered at an extra cost of \$6/hour if prepaid OR \$8.00/hour if not prepaid. June's prepaid form and payment will be due on Thursday, May 24th.

SNACK AND LUNCH: A healthy snack will be provided by the school.

Please pack a healthy and nutritious lunch for your child each day. GPCP is a NUT FREE environment. NO NUTS OF ANY KIND ARE ALLOWED on campus.

RESCHEDULING AND CANCELLATION: Please take into consideration the following policies when changing your date(s)/session(s) or canceling your registration.

- **Session Changes:** Changes to sessions must be emailed with at least two weeks notice prior to the beginning of the first session enrolled. The following are the deadlines for changes by session: Session I: May 21st - Session II: May 28th - Session III: June 4th - Session IV: June 11th - Session V: June 18th - Session VI: July 2nd - Session VII: July 9th
- **Cancellations and Refunds:** Cancellations made by May 21st, 2018 are eligible for a 50% refund, except for the deposit which is non-refundable (payment of the first session).

There will be no refunds for Summer Camp after May 21st, 2018.

SESSION DATES AND CAMP OPTION (Rising Kindergarteners up to 11 years old)

Session I : June 4 - June 8

<i>Farm to Table Laboratory</i>	Enter the food laboratory! Children will experiment with taste, aroma, aesthetics of presentation, nutrition, cooking and some countertop kitchen science. We will create recipes for new and interesting breads, salads, pasta dishes, beverages, summer treats and cool eats. Come prepared for a culinary adventure. It's going to get messy!
<i>Swim Camp</i>	Swim lessons will be offered by a certified swim instructor from the City of Atlanta and children will be supervised by our own GPCP educators. Before or after the swim lessons, the children will enjoy sports, games and a picnic lunch in the park. Swimmers bring their own sack lunch each day. Remember, no nuts, please!

Session II: June 11 - June 15

<i>Sewing Camp</i>	Children will be exposed to the concept of repurposing materials, converting waste materials into beautiful things through the language of sewing, one of earth's oldest human material languages. Children will express themselves by creating clothing, jewelry, and accessories with found objects while being environmentally conscious.
<i>Swim Camp</i>	Same as above (see Session I)

Session III: June 18 - June 22

Session IV: June 25 – June 29

We will delve into daily yoga classes, where we will move our bodies in the way of animals, go on imaginary adventures, and practice guided meditations.
